What should I already know?

- Muslims believe in God and call him Allah and use the Qur'an to learn about their religion.
- Christians believe that God is made up of the Holy Trinity; God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit.
- Muslims believe in the last prophet
 Muhammed and use the stories that he told to learn about God.
- Christians use stories from the Bible to help them learn about how God interacted with his people.

Vocabulary

Hinduism - the religion that Hindus believe in.

Hindu - a person who follows the religion of Hinduism.

Deity - a god or goddess in ancient religion

Brahma - the deity that Hindus believe created life.

Vishnu - the deity that Hindus believe oversees and preserves life.

Shiva- the deity that Hindus believe destroy life.

Trimurti - the trio of deities that Hindus believe in.

What will I know by the end of this unit of work?

- Hindus believe in the Trimurti - Brahma (creator), Vishnu (preserver), Shiva (destroyer).
- Hindus use texts to learn about 'the indescribable' such as Bhagavad Gita.

- Suggest why having a faith or belief in something can be hard
- Identify how and say why it makes a difference in people's lives to believe in God.
- Identify some similarities and differences between ideas about what God is like in different religions.
