 What should I already know? Muslims believe in God, call him Allah and use the Qur'an to learn about their religion. Christians believe that God is made up of the Holy Trinity; God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Hindus believe in the Trimurti - Brahma (creator), Vishnu (preserver), Shiva (destroyer). 	 What will I know by the end of this unit of work? How following a religion or belief can be beneficial in someone's life. How following a religion or belief can be challenging in someone's life. That Christians interpret the text of Genesis in different ways which affects their beliefs.

Express thoughtful ideas about the impact of believing or not believing in God on someone's life (expressing their own ideas and arguments, using evidence and examples)
